(Morristown, NJ)— The Morris Museum will be open on Monday, Feb. 15 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. for the Presidents' Day Holiday. The whole family will enjoy a visit to the museum's current exhibitions and special holiday programs.

Children of all ages can participate in the Presidents' Day Workshop from noon to 3 pm. Recreate Lincoln's log cabin, or the historic White House, using craft materials. Workshop fee: \$4/child for members; \$5/child for non-members.

The Morris Museum's Bickford Theatre will be screening *Gore Vidal's Lincoln* at 1 p.m. The 1988 Emmy Award-winning mini-series tells the story of Abraham Lincoln's life from his humble beginnings, to the most powerful position in the world, to his sudden, shocking end at the Fords Theatre. Starring Sam Waterston as Lincoln and Mary Tyler Moore as Mary Todd; running time is 188 minutes; rated PG-13. **Free with museum admission.**
